A reception was held at the Seymour Community Center on March 4, 2022 to award special grants from the Greater Seymour Trust Fund. The Board of Managers annually awards special one-time grants from the Evie Scott Fund, the Verna Robertson Fund, the Miriam Newkirk Fund, the Maude Welch Fund and the Nellie Kloeker Fund. In order to qualify for the grant funds, all organizations must have an IRS 501(c)(3) designation, and the funds must be used within the City of Seymour.

The following grants were awarded:

Actors Community Theatre of Seymour was awarded \$500 for wireless speakers and lapel microphones.

Big Brothers Big Sisters was awarded \$550 for database software subscriptions.

Boys & Girls Club was awarded \$500 for tables and chairs in their Tween program room.

Child Care Network was awarded \$786 for new tablets and protective covers.

City of Seymour Parks & Rec Department was awarded \$500 for a new laptop computer.

Community Agency Building, Inc. was awarded \$949 for a new laptop computer.

Community Provisions of Jackson County was awarded \$800 for a new DVR for their security system.

Everyday Connections was awarded \$500 for a new desktop computer and scanner.

Girls, Inc. was awarded \$500 for new gym equipment.

Immanuel Lutheran Child Care Ministry was awarded \$1,806 for a new desktop computer, office desk, and tables.

Jackson County Clothing Center was awarded \$700 for a new security system.

Jackson County Education Coalition was awarded \$1,750 towards the cost of two new copy machines.

Jackson County United Way was awarded \$2,000 for editing software, tripod, and protective case.

Lutheran Community Home was awarded \$1,500 for RetailTracker software in their Walnut Manor facility.

Matthew 25 Street Ministries (The Alley) was awarded \$800 for a new laptop computer.

Mental Health America was awarded \$150 for new file cabinets and other equipment.

Reins to Recovery was awarded \$800 for a new desktop computer, software, and printer.

Riverview Cemetery was awarded \$709 for a new Sawzall and chainsaw.

Seymour Meals on Wheels was awarded \$750 for new laser printer and printer stand.

Seymour Museum was awarded \$500 to purchase new drywall for the museum entryway.

Southern Indiana Center for the Arts was awarded \$850 for new letters and numbers for their marquee message board.

Turning Point Domestic Violence Services was awarded \$300 for two new filing storage cabinets.

Schneck Medical Center was awarded \$6,150 from the *Maude Welch Fund* for the continuing education of nurses.

The Greater Seymour Trust Fund was established in 1969 by the late E. S. Welch to serve the cultural, scientific, religious, literary and educational needs of the community. The Trust receives funds from the public as gifts or bequests to be held by the trustee, JCBank.

A Board of Managers of the Trust Fund allocates the money from the Trust for a wide range of public purposes. Its purpose is to assist, encourage and promote the welfare of present and future residents of the community without regard to race, color or creed. The Board of Managers consists of the Mayor of Seymour, the President & CEO of JCBank, the SVP, Chief Wealth Management Officer of JCBank, and four at-large members of the community.
